The neighbourhood area

The area to be covered by the forum and plan is bounded by the A40 Westway to the south, Wood Lane to the west, St Mark's Road to the east, and Dalgarno Gardens to the north.

It includes part of the St Quintin Estate, a conservation area mainly comprising Edwardian houses, and the Woodlands site previously owned by the BBC, and currently being developed as the West London campus of Imperial College.



The area is partly in the Royal Borough of Kensington and Chelsea and partly in the London Borough of Hammersmith and Fulham. The part within Kensington and Chelsea is being designated by the council for neighbourhood planning purposes. Hammersmith and Fulham council has yet to make a decision on designation for the part in its borough.

This leaflet was produced by St Helens Residents Association. The association has initiated the establishment of the Neighbourhood Forum and is organising the preliminary activities needed to start work on the Neighbourhood Plan.

The association will continue as a separate organisation representing local resident's interests.
